As a result of my appeal of FOIA 1756 denial (apparently a misunderstanding), I am in receipt of "data used to verify compliance with Oakland County Medical Control Authority EMS response time as required by protocol 6-18" for the 2017 Township Compliance letter. What I received is attached.

This data was apparently used by you to support the claim below in the 2017 Compliance letter which received in a recent FOIA.

The data shows an average EMS response time of 6 minutes and 1 second (6:01); but no 90% fractile data.

Can you tell me the method by which this average was converted to the **90% Fractile Value** required by OCMCA 6-18? This is defined in 6-18, page 1, as "***The value or measurement at which 90% of all events occur. This is typically used in time measurements to better standardize performance across systems***"
