Oakland Township Fire Department Tasks are many and Increasing

On the side of our township ambulances and other vehicles it says "Oakland Township and Rescue". It could say Oakland Township Fire, Rescue, Medical Emergencies & All Other Emergencies.

Every 911 call creates an incident report. Incidents are also sometimes referred to as "runs" or "calls". The incident is recorded with details of who responded and when, what the problem was, etc.




One surprise and concern to me was 40 vehicle accidents with injuries. (Category 322).

Incidents are on the rise. That is not surprising to me as the population has increased 53% since the year 2000 (from 13,071 in 2000, to 16,779 in 2010 to 20,067 in 2020). What is surprising is that incidents per 100 residents has also increased, especially in the last year. We had 3.8 incidents per 100 residents in 2006. Last year it increased to 7.1. So where our Fire Department had 1469 incidents in 2021, if we residents were calling 911 at the same rate per 100 residents as on 2006 our Fire Department would have had only 766 incidents last year.





Maybe we are aging? But that can't be the entire explanation as non-medical incidents are also on the rise per 100 residents.
