


Welcome Spring!

Soil prep, Planting and Maintenance Of Dwarf Apple Trees

We will have hands-on field work in the apple orchard. Learn about soil sampling for lime or sulfur to correct the soil pH, P &/ or K to correct soil nutrients, and tillage to incorporate any deficiencies per the soil report. Best practices will be covered for excellent locations, care, and pruning maintenance.

Please bring gloves, bypass pruners or loppers.
This program runs rain or shine. Dress appropriately for outdoor Michigan weather conditions. Ages 14 and up.

Master Gardener Clay Ottoni has been farming for over five decades growing fruit trees, cover crops, row crops, and vegetables. He regularly volunteers for MSU Extension Tollgate Education Center, earning the Golden Shovel Award. He is a member of MI Nut and Fruit Growers Association, High Density Orchard, National Wild Turkey Federation, Pheasants Forever, and has been involved with 4H and several beekeeping clubs.
