## Oakland Township Fire Department (OTFD) Concerns

After 10 years, I still have the following concerns developed from information obtained mostly via FOIA (Freedom of Information Act)

## Ambulance Response Time

- 1. It is likely that OTFD does not meet standards for ambulance / paramedic response times required by Oakland County Medical Control Authority (OCMCA) for a licensed Advanced Life Support (ALS) agency. We are shown no data.
- 2. The most recent data (2019) I developed by examining data obtained via FOIA was 11.1 minutes, 90% response time vs. requirement of 8 minutes. As our population now exceeds 500 per square mile, the standard tightens to 6 minutes.
- 3. The public seems unaware of this issue. Of course, I am unaware of any public presentation or examination of any response time data ever and my previous reports have perhaps been too wordy.

## Fire Department Staffing

- 4. The OTFD effort started in March 2018 to comply with staffing required by OCMCA (after a letter from OCMCA saying that OTFD did not comply) by hiring part-time personnel is likely a poor option that has likely resulted in
  - a. high turnover of part-time personnel resulting in
    - i. high cost of training and special personal gear that is discarded due to turnover of personnel (they go to a full-time job elsewhere ASAP)
    - ii. inexperienced people responding to medical emergencies
  - b. full-time personnel working many, many hours
    - i. possibly not well-rested for some responses
    - ii. not a sustainable manpower model

The data and letters to support the above are in this previous posting to my website when I gave up on this issue in frustration with our Board and my fellow residents.
